Getting Around: Located on the south side of the Tempe campus close to the Sun Devil Fitness Complex, Vista del Sol and Sonora Hall, Adelphi Commons II contains six units that offer a variety of amenities that include a large multi-purpose center, common area laundry facilities and common area kitchens. Nearby Sonora Hall features the Sonora Market convenience store and is in close proximity to dining halls in HAV and Barrett.

Amenities, Room Features:

- Twin XL beds (36 x 80)
- Window & blinds
- Desk & chairs
- Waste/Recycle basket
- Wi-Fi and high-speed internet
- Modified rooms for students with disabilities
- Laundry facilities
- Secure key card access
- Weekly social activities
- Community kitchens in each unit lounge
- Flat screen TV in each unit lounge

Meals:

- A stipend for meals will be provided directly to the student. Students may choose to purchase a meal plan through ASU.
- There are several locations on campus open during summer hours.
- A trip to the grocery store can be arranged for students upon arrival.
- There are many restaurants, with various price ranges, all within walking distance. The residence hall is within a block of the light rail allowing access to any type of retail or other resource needed (although there are plenty within walking distance).

Tempe campus:

The energetic environment of the campus comprises broad pedestrian malls and eclectic architecture set amid subtropical landscaping. Landmarks include the iconic, century-old Palm Walk; Old Main, the oldest original campus building; Sun Devil Stadium and ASU's other Pac-12 athletic venues; and the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Gammage Auditorium. With an unrivaled commitment to sustainability, the Tempe campus is the most solar-powered of any in the U.S., and offers easy access to all of metropolitan Phoenix through public transit including light rail.

Transportation**Air Transportation**

Informational only: Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport is located on the light rail, which runs directly to the campus area.

Ground Transportation

Students who bring a vehicle will rely on first-come, first-served free parking on nearby streets. This is fairly ample in summer, but is not guaranteed to be available within a reasonable distance to carry items to and from a vehicle.

It is suggested that students be familiar with apps such as Uber or Lyft to allow themselves freedom to travel to points outside of the immediate area, in groups where possible, if they are comfortable.

- Sun Devil Fitness Center at the Tempe Campus is readily accessible, walking distance.
- There are ample parks, businesses, events, and shopping in the Mill Avenue and surrounding area, all within walking distance to campus.

Social Activities

Faculty may invite students over to their residences for dinner and games, when applicable. There will be optional activities planned depending upon interest level. Students are encouraged to bring money for personal excursions and purchases. BUILD students may participate in social activities with the Tempe IMSD program.

Laura Kaufman is available to help arrange group outings and excursions, as needed. The Tempe campus and immediate area (Tempe Town Lake) has many events during the summer.
